Induction of First-Year Students at the University of Zambia.

Inducting students on the intricacies of a student loan scheme is paramount in ensuring informed decision-making and responsible financial management throughout their academic journey. On March 29, 2024, the Higher Education Loans and Scholarships Board (HELSB) conducted the induction ceremony for first-year students at the University of Zambia who have been awarded Student Loans for the 2023/2024 academic year.

Led by Acting Deputy Director of Operations, Mr. Derrick Chisanga, the HELSB team welcomed the new cohort of students and provided them with valuable information regarding their student loans. During the session, students were informed about the following new changes to the student loan program:

1.Meal Allowance Upgrade: The meal allowance has been upgraded from K22.50 per day to K25.00 to better support students while they are in school.

2.Registration Fees Coverage: HELSB will now cover registration fees for all students on HELSB sponsorship, easing the financial burden on students and their families.

3.Accommodation Refund: HELSB sponsored students who are not accommodated will receive an accommodation refund equivalent to the minimum a mount provided for students who are accommodated, ensuring fair treatment for all. Following the presentation, students had the opportunity to ask questions and clarify any doubts they may have had.

We are committed to supporting students on their educational journey and ensuring that they have the resources they need to succeed. Congratulations to all the new students, and we wish you a fruitful and fulfilling academic year ahead!

Information Enhancement (HELSB meets Chief Madzimawe.

We are thrilled to share a significant development in our efforts to expand access to education and opportunities in Zambia. On February 23, 2024, His Royal Highness, Chief Madzimawe of the Ngoni people in Kasenengwa District, Eastern Province, called for continued collaboration with the Higher Education Loans and Scholarships Board (HELSB) to enhance information dissemination about HELSB services in the region and across Zambia.

During a courtesy call by HELSB members of staff at his palace in Mutenguleni Village, Chief Madzimawe emphasized the importance of improving awareness about HELSB services among the people of Eastern Province. He noted that lack of information had prevented some individuals from accessing HELSB services.

In response to Chief Madzimawe's call, Ms. Chiselwa Kawanda, Senior Corporate Communications Officer at HELSB, expressed concern about the low number of girls enrolled in the Keeping Girls in School (KGS) initiative at the tertiary level in Eastern Province. Ms. Kawanda highlighted that currently, only two (2) students from Eastern Province were sponsored under the KGS program.

Ms. Kawanda emphasized the need to increase the number of applicants from the province, as the KGS initiative was available to all enrolled female students. She explained that the KGS initiative fund for tertiary education was administered by the Ministry of Education through HELSB.

In an effort to address this issue and increase awareness of HELSB services, His Royal Highness graciously opened the doors of his palace for further engagement with HELSB. This collaboration presented an invaluable opportunity to reach more individuals and ensure that education opportunities were accessible to all who needed them in Eastern Province and beyond.

We were grateful for Chief Madzimawe's support and looked forward to working closely with him to empower students and promote education throughout the region.

STUDENT LOAN ELIGIBILTY

- Must be Zambian with a Green NRC.
- Has attained 24 years of age or less at the time of award.

APPEAL PROCESS

Eligibility for Appeal - must have applied with HELSB when the advertisement was running. When - Immediately the list is published. Documentation to attach:

- Appeal Letter stating grounds for appeal;
- Photocopy of the University Admission Letter;
- Photocopy of the Grade 12 Certificate or Statement of Results;
- Photocopy of the Deposit Slip and HELSB Student Loan Application Form; and
- Photocopy of the candidate's NRC.

CHANGE OF STATUS

- This is when a student wants to change the sponsorship status from self to HELSB.
- Students must meet the criteria that was set at the time they entered university.
- Must submit the following documents immediately the University seasonal results are out:
- Photocopy of the University Admission letter;
- Photocopy of the Grade 12 Certificate or Statement of Results;
- Photocopy of the candidate's NRC; and
- University Sessional results.

REACTIVATION

A student may reactive a student loan when the student who:

- - progressive year of study;
 - Withdrew on maternity ground proceeds to a progressive year of study; and

A student is required to apply immediately the sessional results are out and attach relevant documents (e.g. sessional results, letter from doctor, letter from university).

SCHOLARSHIPS

- A scholarship is a monetary award granted to students to help them pay for their education. Unlike student loans, scholarships do not require repayment. to education and fostering academic excellence.
- HELSB scholarships are awarded to Zambian students under undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.
- These awards are made possible through multilateral, bilateral and partnership agreements.
