JANUARY 2025: LAYING STRATEGIC FOUNDATIONS

5 January 2025: Brunei-HELSB Scholarship Launch

HELSB and the Brunei Government officially launched fully funded scholarships for Zambian students in critical fields including Engineering, ICT, Medicine, Finance, and Environmental Sciences.

The announcement highlighted the Zambian Government's commitment to strengthening human capital in sectors vital to national development.



6 January 2025: Provincial Rollout & Stakeholder Engagements

Scholarship distribution efforts were extended across all 10 provinces, emphasizing that selection would be regionally competitive to identify top candidates. HELSB, in collaboration with the Ministries of Education and Justice, reviewed the current Higher Education Loans and Scholarships Act to strengthen legal frameworks and delivery.



7-9 January 2025: Sector Consultations

Meetings with the Deputy Permanent Secretary of Muchinga Province and Permanent Secretary of Central Province addressed the modernization of HELSB's Act and discussed initiatives like 'Keeping Girls in School', aimed at narrowing gender disparities in higher education.




14 January 2025: Strategic Partnership Meetings

CEO Dr. John Machayi met with Access Bank Zambia to explore digital financing solutions and reduce barriers for student loan uptake. On the same day, discussions with UNZASU President Dickson Matabo focused on enhancing student support networks and facilitating seamless loan disbursement.




21–22 January 2025: Private Sector Engagement & Diaspora Mobilization

The landmark US\$100,000 scholarship partnership with Konkola Copper Mines was launched in Chingola. Simultaneously, HELSB led a delegation to the Zambian High Commission in London, where discussions centered on developing structured diaspora loan repayment programmes.



27-30 January 2025: Media Outreach & Student Orientation

CEO Dr. Machayi participated in interviews on Ingoma TV and with Times of Zambia, underscoring the impact of the KCM partnership. A student loan orientation at Kwame Nkrumah University prepared over 300 first-year students with insights on repayment plans, grace periods, and insurance coverage.



FEBRUARY 2025: SUSTAINING GROWTH AND ENHANCING SYSTEMS

4 February 2025: Expanded Loan Disbursement

HELSB awarded student loans to first-year cohorts at Copperbelt University, Kapasa Makasa University, Zambia University College of Technology, and UNZA, collectively benefitting over 4,700 students.

5-6 February 2025: Media Engagement

In interviews with Times of Zambia and Ingoma TV, Dr. Machayi detailed HELSB's commitment to increasing access, including support for students in rural areas and improvements in loan processing time.

7 February 2025: Cuban Government Scholarships

HELSB invited applications for Cuban scholarships in Medicine, Social Sciences, Art History, and Sociocultural Development, providing full coverage for tuition, living expenses, accommodation, and a 12-month Spanish language immersion course.

11 - 12 February 2025: Legal Reform Summit

At a two-day summit in Lusaka, HELSB engaged with the Ministries of Education and Justice to begin drafting the revised Loans and Scholarships Act, integrating best practices to broaden access and ensure financial sustainability.



13-14 February 2025: Financial Sector Collaboration

Meetings with Zambia Industrial Commercial Bank focused on digital repayment platforms and loan security mechanisms. Orientation at Kapasa Makasa University trained 300+ students on financial discipline and loan management.

15 February 2025: International Scholarship Drive

HELSB connected with the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission, initiating efforts to increase the number of Zambian candidates for shared master's and split-site PhD opportunities.

18 February 2025:Financial Literacy Drive

Loan disbursements to 573 ZUCT students were accompanied by a comprehensive financial literacy workshop, led by Deputy Director - Credit and Scholarships Mr. Derrick Chisanga, covering budgeting, interest, and repayment obligations.



19-22 February 2025: 20-Year Anniversary & Media Briefing



In his speech Dr. Machayi A updated the public on key metrics—over 1 million Zambians financed, K90 million recovered in 2024, and 512 remitting institutions. Celebrating two decades, HESLB hosted dignitaries that included Tanzania's Prime Minister Kassim Majaliwa.

25-27 February 2025: New Scholarship Programmes

Applications opened for emerging scholarship opportunities from Romania, the Coimbra Group, and the Korean Development Institute (KDI), targeting STEM, public policy, and social development.


14 March 2025: Institutional Capacity Boost

APRIL 2025: LEARNERS SENSITIZATION AND RADIO ENGAGEMENT

3-10 April 2025: HELSB Reaches Over 3,900 Pupils in Northern Province with Life-Changing Higher Education Information

Between April 3rd and 10th, 2025, HELSB embarked on a comprehensive sensitization tour across Northern Province, reaching more than 3,900 pupils in Kasama, Mporokoso, and Luwingu Districts. The initiative, led by Corporate Affairs Manager Ms. Chiselwa Kawanda, aimed to empower rural learners with critical knowledge about accessing student loans and scholarships.

The tour began with a courtesy call to Northern Provincial Education Standards Officer Mrs. Lina Kamanga, followed by school outreach programmes and a live radio engagement on Kasama Radio. Pupils from Lualuo, Kasama Boys, Mubanga Chipoya, Ituna, PEAS, and Henry Kapata Secondary Schools benefitted from in-depth information on HELSB services, including application procedures and repayment options.

The team extended its reach to Mporokoso and Luwingu Districts, engaging district education officials and sensitizing learners from schools such as St. Don Bosco, Saili, and others. Through both in-person visits and on-air discussions, HELSB reaffirmed its commitment to bridging the information gap in underserved areas, giving thousands of students a clearer pathway to higher education.

EGYPT AL-AZHAR AL-SHARIF SCHOLARSHIPS 2025/2026

The Al-Azhar Al-Sharif Scholarships for the 2025/2026 academic year were launched. Seven undergraduate scholarships were offered in various fields, including Computer Science, Mechanical Engineering, and General Medicine, with full tuition, living allowances, and return air tickets provided. This programme was designed to support Zambian Muslim youth pursuing higher education in Egypt. A press release was issued for the launch of the Al-Azhar Al-Sharif Scholarships 2025/2026.

The three-day engagement focused on sharing best practices in student loan recovery, digital transformation, scholarship management, and human resource development.

The visit included courtesy calls to institutions such as the Public Service Management Division (PSMD) and the Emoluments Commission, where discussions centred on enhancing performance management systems and employee retention strategies. The exchange underscored a strong commitment by both Boards to strengthen regional collaboration and improve higher education service delivery across borders.

- Must be Zambian with a green NRC.
- Has attained 26 years of age or less at the time of award.
- Must be admitted at one of the nine public universities under Student Loan Scheme.
- Must be a school leaver who successfully completed secondary school within the last four years.

HELSB Student Loan Application Process - Step-by-Step



1. Sign Up (if you haven't yet)

- Visit: https://portal.helsb.gov.zm
- Click **Sign Up** to create an account.
- Provide your valid NRC, email address and phone number (A PIN will be sent to your email address/phone number so make sure it is yours and it is functional).
- Select New Student card
- View the terms and conditions and accept the terms and conditions then click Submit

2. Upload Profile Picture

- After account creation, you'll be prompted to upload a passport-sized photo.
 - o **Format**: PNG or JPEG
- o **Maximum** Size: 8MB
- Click "Next" to proceed.

3. Sign In

- Use your newly created credentials to log in to the student dashboard.
- o USERNAME: NRC, Email or phone number
- o PIN: Secret PIN

4. Verify Phone and Email

- Navigate to the **Registration** section.
- Click verify phone number and verify using the One-Time Password (OTP) sent to vou.
- Click verify email and verify using the **One-Time Password (OTP)** sent to you.

- Select and provide details of your Last School, Exam number, and subjects pursued.
- Enter results as required (e.g., Grade 12 certificates or tertiary qualifications).
- If GCE results are being considered, indicate the first school and first year when you wrote your G12 exams

8. Attach Required Documents

Upload the supporting documents:

- NRC (front and back)
- Guardian's NRC
- Academic Transcripts (Attach GCE and Grade 12 Certificate on one document if applicable)
- Acceptance Letter
- Certified Disability Certification (if applicable)
- Passport photo

Note: Ensure all files meet the size and format specifications indicated.

9. Apply for the Loan

- Go to the "Loan Application" section in the dashboard.
- Select the University you want to apply to
- Fill in the required fields and review your application.

10. Pay K100 Application Fee

- Enter your **mobile number.**
- A prompt will appear on your phone to enter your PIN in order to authorize the payment.
- Fee: **K100.00**
- Once payment is successful, your application is submitted.

11. Await Application Updates

- · You'll receive updates on your dashboard and via email/SMS.
- Monitor the **application status** regularly to track progress.


SCHOLARSHIPS

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- Must be Zambian with a green NRC.
- Be a school leaver who completed secondary school within the timeframe stipulated by the host Country or Partner.
- Be a holder of a first degree graded as prescribed by the host Country or Partner for Master's degree candidates. The first degree shall be relevant to the programme of study applied for.
- Be a holder of a Master's degree for PhD candidates.
- Be of a particular age as stated by the host Country or Partner.
- Must have a valid Zambian passport.
- Must have a birth certificate (some countries like Morocco).
- Countries may have additional scholarships conditions.
- Note: It is a requirement by the host country that all nominated candidates undergo comprehensive medical examinations.



HELSB Participated at the Annual LAZ Conference: Introduces upcoming Discount Campaign for Loan Beneficiaries





On 9th May 2025, HELSB introduced its new online student loan application system, making it easier for students across Zambia to apply for financial support for higher education.


Students can now follow a simple step-by-step process (page 23) on the HELSB website to apply. The online system helps guide users through every stage; creating an account, entering personal details, and uploading important documents like NRCs, school transcripts, and acceptance letters from universities.

To complete the application, students need to pay a non-refundable fee of ZMW 100 using mobile money.

The system also uses one-time passwords (OTPs) to confirm your phone number and email, making the process more secure. You'll also get updates by SMS and email about your application status, so it's easier to stay informed.

If you need to change any information after submitting, the system allows you to edit your profile easily. And if you run into any problems while signing up or uploading documents, HELSB has added a feedback form on the website so you can report issues and get help quickly.

This new online system is a big step forward in making student loan applications faster, more transparent, and more accessible for all students in Zambia.








HELSB Hosts Malawian Delegation for Regional Benchmarking Visit on Higher Education Financing







From 2nd-6th June 2025, the Chief Executive Officer of HELSB, Dr. John Machayi, attended a pivotal Document Review Workshop at Ciela Resort, focused on establishing a national roadmap for the regularisation and implementation of the UNESCO Qualifications Passport (UQP) Initiative in Zambia.

This workshop, coordinated by the Zambia Qualifications Authority with support from UNESCO, produced actionable recommendations to ensure inclusive access to higher education and employment for all regardless of background or displacement status.
